Position Key Accountabilities:

The Rank of Assistant Professor NTC in Vascular Surgery will teach, participate in clinical service, administrative, and provide direct patient care and supervision of medical students and residents in clinic and hospital settings.

-Participating in the Vascular Surgery practice in the Northeast area Memorial Hermann locations; including participation in a UT general Vascular Surgery physician group call team for coverage.

- b) Assisting when requested with the collection of research data, including biological specimens and
- c) Providing information and education on ongoing research studies to potentially eligible research subjects.
